IQAC has conducted Student Satisfaction Survey among the students of Dr. N.S.A.M. First Grade College for the indicator under criterion II teaching, learning and evaluation. The students have been shared a questionnaire on co-curricular, extra-curricular, infrastructure and transport to give their responses. The institution's vision and mission were to give quality education to all the students. The college has faculty members who are well qualified and experienced in various disciplines. The students reviewed that the teaching and learning process in the institution with the implementation of ICT tools and modern and distinctive pedagogical methods enabled them to perform better.

The students have expressed their satisfaction on completion of syllabus on time and usage of experiential, participative and problem-solving methodology by the teachers. At the outset students have appreciated that continuous evaluation, assessment of assignments, student presentations and participation in quizzes and various other competitions enabled them to face the summative assessments without fear. Students were satisfied with the facility of language lab, business lab and digital library exposing them to experiential learning. Students opined that mentoring, solving grievances through counsellor, field visits and community-oriented services were productive.

Faculties identified the strengths and weaknesses of the students so as to enhance the intra-and inter-personal skills and improve their soft skills to be better equipped for the workplace/industry.
